Read a third time, and passed the Bill for raising a Revenue.

ORDERED, That the Master in Chancery do inform the House of Assembly, that the Legislative Council have agreed to the said Bill.

Message from the Assembly, by Mr. Taylor, with a Bill, intituled "A Bill to appropriate a part of the Public Revenue for the services therein mentioned," to which they desire the concurrence of this House.

Read a first, second and third time, and passed the said Bill.

ORDERED, That the Master in Chancery do inform the House of Assembly, that the Legislative Council have agreed to the said Bill.

Mr. Baillie moved the following resolution :

RESOLVED, That this House in concurring to the Bills for appropriating the Public Revenue, and which severally contain a clause affecting the privileges of this House, as well as private rights, doth so concur in order to prevent the injury, distress and difficulties which would arise to the Province from their rejection; such concurrence is nevertheless not to be drawn into a precedent for the future.
