

On Motion of Dr. *M'Aulay*, seconded by Mr. *Townsend*, That the said Bill be recommitted, The House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House to take the said Bill into re-consideration, (Mr. *Goff*, in the Chair,) and after some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported, That the Committee had agreed to the Bill with amendments.

The House having taken into consideration the Bill intituled, "An Act to regulate the admission of Barristers, Attornies, and Solicitors," with the subject matter of the report of the conference thereon.

On Motion of Mr. *Bagnall*, seconded by ~~Mr.~~ Dr. *M'Aulay*, That the said Bill be sent up to his Majesty's Council, with the amendment before proposed thereto, The Question being put, the House divided, and there appeared,

The Motion was accordingly carried in the affirmative.

Ordered, That Mr. *Bagnall*, do carry the Bill intituled, "an Act to regulate the admission of Barristers, Attornies, and Solicitors," up to His Majesty's Council, and acquaint them that this House doth adhere to its former amendment.

On Motion of Mr. *Bagnall*, seconded by Mr. *McLaran*, The House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take into consideration, the Bill intituled, "An Act for repealing certain parts of an Act made and passed in the Fourteenth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled an Act for regulating the measure of Boards, and all other kinds of Lumber, and for appointing Officers to survey the same, and for declaring what shall be deemed Merchantable Timber for exportation," (Mr. *Bagnall*, in the Chair) and after some time spent therein, the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported, that the Committee had agreed to the Bill.

Ordered, that the report of the Committee be agreed to.

On Motion of Mr. *Nelson*, seconded by Mr. *Bagnall*, the said Bill received the third reading and passed.

On Motion of Mr. *Bagnall*, seconded by Mr. Dr. *M'Aulay*, the said Bill was ordered to be engrossed, and sent up to his Majesty's Council for their concurrence.

Adjourned till half past 5 o'clock this afternoon.

On Motion of Mr. *Bagnall*, seconded by Mr. *Murray*, That the Bill intituled "an Act for promoting Education and encouraging Schools throughout the Island, having received the third reading, do pass, ordered accordingly, and also that the same be engrossed, and sent up to his Majesty's Council for their concurrence.

On Motion of Mr. *McNeill*, seconded by Dr. *M'Aulay*, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take into consideration the Bill intituled, "An Act to alter and amend the High Road Law, and better regulate the same," (Mr. *McNeill*, in the Chair,) and after some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported Progress and asked leave to sit again.
