On Motion of Dr. M'Aulay, seconded by Mr. Townsend, That the said Bill be recommitted, The House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House to take the said Bill into re-consideration, Mr. Goff, in the Chair,) and after some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported, That the Committee had agreed to the Bill with amendments.

The House having taken into confideration the Bill intituled, "An Act to reregulate the admission of Barristers, Attornies, and Solicitors," with the subject

matter of the report of the conference thereon.

On Motion of Mr. Bagnall, seconded by int. Dr. M'aulay, That the said Bill be sent up to his Majesty's Council, with the amendment before proposed thereto, The Question being put, the House divided, and there appeared,

Laran, The House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, to take into consideration, the Bill intituled, "An Act for repealing certain parts of an Act made and passed in the "Fourteenth Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intituled an Act for regu. "lating the measure of Boards, and all other kinds of Lumber, and for ap. "pointing Officers to survey the same, and for declaring what shall be deemed "Merchantable Timber for exportation," (Mr. Bagnall, in the Chair) and after some time spent therein, the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported, that the Committee had agreed to the Bill.

Ordered, that the report of the Committee be agreed to.

On Motion of Mr. Nelson, seconded by Mr. Bagnall, the said Bill received

the third reading and passed.
