In Heavy Sea Performance of Yacht Was Beautiful to Watch.

Before Shamrock bade farewell to the English coast, Col. Neill, who is making the voyage on board the steam yacht Erin, which is acting as convoy on the trans-Atlantic voyage, pressed the challenger hard in order to test her gear and her ocean rig.
