HON. DR. PUGSLEY TO VISIT NEWCASTLE.

Was Bathurst Last Week and Inspected Harbor There.

WILL PROBABLY SPEAK HERE THURSDAY.

Will Look Over Site Selected by the Drummonds for the Shipment of Ore Here.

Hon. Wm. Pugsley, Minister of

Public Works, reached his summer residence at Rethesay by the Ocean Limited Saturday night after his tour of the Dominion. The Minister is slightly fatigued after the labors attendant on his tour and will remain here some time. While in St. John he will be tendered a complimentary banquet by his political friends of this city and the province in general.

The Minister of Public Works expressed himself as being satisfied with the results of his tour which placed him in touch with practically all parts of Canada. He was particularly impressed with the possibilities of the northern part of this province, which he visited during the latter part of his tour.

ENTHUSIASTICALLY RECEIVED.

Hon. Mr. Pugsley was enthusiastically received at both Campbellton and Bathurst. The first-named place was visited on Friday. The Minister was taken on a special train over the International Railway which is being built from Campbellton to St. Leonard's and which is rapidly nearing completion. Hon. Mr. Pugsley was enabled to judge of what benefit the new railway would be to the northern section of the province in opening both lumbering and settlement lands.

The minister also made an inspection of the water front of Campbellton, where certain improvements have been asked.

FRIDAY WAS SPENT BY MR. PUGSLEY at Bathurst. There the annual inspection of the harbor and in the evening attended a banquet given in his honor and also a reception in his honor.

PEACEFUL TRAVELING. The chief purpose of the Government of the Province of Quebec is to develop the port of Bathurst as a port. The Drummond steamer will need a port for the purpose of shipping ore, which will eventually use Bathurst as that port. Bathurst Harbor needs much improvement, however, before it can be used as a port. Extensive dredging will be necessary and the people of Bathurst are desirous of having the Department of Public Works made aware of the needs of their harbor.

The minister was very favorably impressed with the harbor at both Campbellton and Bathurst.

A telegram from St. John advised him that Hon. Dr. Pugsley would be here on Thursday afternoon and that he will probably address a public meeting in the Ocean House Hotel on Thursday night.

Dr. Pugsley is living in a room in the winter place opposite the ocean through which has not been finished yet, yet he has made a tour of Canada extending into its possibilities and is finishing his tour by an inspection of facilities on the North Shore. While here he will look over the proposed wharf site of the Dominion people for shipping iron. He will also visit Gaspé.

TWELVE DROWNED
LIVES LOST.

Mexican Flood Causes Great Devastation and Ruin.

CANADIANS HARD HIT.

Ninety-Six Hours Downpour has Caused Enormous Damage to Many Sections.

Montgomery, Minn., Aug. 28.—Five hundred persons are without food, clothing, and property damage to the extent of \$12,000,000, as a result of a flood which inundated the city between 11 and 12 o'clock yesterday morning.

SO DROWNED.

Mexico City, Mex., Aug. 28.—The Associated Press correspondent at Monterrey gives the Spanish news bureau the following account of the flood which took place in the city on Aug. 27, 1909. The city is situated on a plain, the losses are the most serious in Mexico. The Mexican Steel Company, \$1,000,000, the Mexican Steel Smelting Co., \$1,000,000, the American Steel Co., \$1,000,000. The city gets aid from the United States.

A special despatch to the Herald says that more than fifteen persons are homeless and that seven have been drowned. The independent estimates the population at 150,000,000.

The surface of Six Lakes and half-bay of Monterrey is under water. The water is rising in the number of streams and the level of rivers is continuing to rise as the water is rising. The flood is the greatest since 1863. The water is rising 200 meters from the banks. It is now 100 meters above the banks. There will be no roads or communication for at least a week.

CANADIANS HARD HIT.

The electric light and street rail way system of Montreal, modern in every respect and constantly in use, three years ago, a Canadian company, in which the MacKenzies of Toronto are heavily interested, was damaged to the extent of approximately \$1,000,000.

The Montreal water and sewerage system suffered a loss estimated at \$1,000,000 or more.

Both the electric and street rail way systems and the water works and drainage system were eliminated by Canadian engineers. A hard hit was made by a Canadian company to some extent for the installation of these modern improvements a few years ago and their loss will be heavy.

It is noted that the river has risen to a height of 50 or 60 feet.
