City Has Been Divided Into Ten of Them.

Mr. Thompson Opens His Campaign This Evening.

Hamilton Liberal Candidates Are Much in Demand.

Work on the registration voters' lists is engaging the attention of the politicians just now.

The Liberal executive expects to be able to announce for a public meeting at an early date.

Returning officers have been appointed for this part of the country as follows: East Hamilton—R. C. Wittigrew.

Below will be found the ten districts into which the city has been divided for the purpose of the registration court.

Division No. 7.—On the south by Robert from Hughson to Emerald to Cannon to Wentworth; on the east by Wellington from Barton to the waterfront; on the north by the waterfront from Wellington to Hughson; on the west by Hughson from the waterfront to Robert.

Division No. 8.—On the south by Evans from Wellington to Emerald to Cannon to Wentworth; on the east by Wentworth from Cannon to the waterfront; on the north by the waterfront from Wentworth to Wellington.

Division No. 9.—On the south by King from Wellington to Wentworth to southern limits to Sherman; on the east by Sherman from the waterfront to Cannon; on the north by Cannon and Sherman to Emerald to Evans to Wellington; on the west by Wellington from Cannon to Evans to King.

Division No. 10.—On the south by Cannon to Sherman to Barton to eastern limits; east by eastern limits to Cannon; on the north by the waterfront from the eastern limit to Wentworth; on the west by Wentworth to waterfront from Cannon.
