Bait Concessions

Some time ago we directed attention to the report in the N. Y. Fishing Gazette about bait and ice concessions to foreigners made by the Government to the Booth Fisheries Co. The Fishing Gazette considered the Company had obtained terms extraordinary favourable to them — the first of the kind ever granted by Newfoundland. Here is a paragraph of the report:

"The Newfoundland Government has never sold an ounce of bait or ice to foreigners, and the satisfactory terms of the contracts made with the Booth Fisheries Co. gave that Company the exclusive concession for fifteen years for these vital materials."

Now that the Premier is back he says that the Company "will agree that no bait fish placed in cold storage will be sold except to Newfoundland fishermen."

This means apparently that the Company has not agreed as yet, but that the Government hope that they will agree to this limitation, which is in direct contradiction to what the American papers were congratulating the Company on having already conceded to them. It looks as if our exposure has done its work and that the Government is backing down. Sir Edward Morris says under his new clause the Booth Company will be more limited in its sale of bait than Trefethen and Lord were under their agreement. That being so, it follows that the Trefethen and Lord agreement permitted them to sell bait to persons who were not Newfoundlanders. It will be remembered how strenuously the Government denied this allegation at the time. Now the truth is out.

Further, people are not going to be satisfied with any such professions as are appearing in the Government press. They want to see the text of the agreement and see for themselves what bait concessions are being given away, and particularly so in view of the practical abandonment this year of bait protection during the first baiting of the bankers.

Some fifty guests attended an informal dinner in the dining room of the King George Institute last night to hear how the Institute might be conducted. Before taking their places at the table the guests were conducted through the building, and the attractiveness, commodiousness, convenience, the fittings and furnishings came in for much praise. The splendid plunge bath and the shower baths particularly attracted attention. The fitting out of this department we are told cost some \$7,000. After dinner the Superintendent outlined the object of the Institute at some length, and called on Dr. Grenfell to supplement his remarks. Mr. G. A. Warburton gave his experience of some twenty-five years in the working of Y. M. C. A.'s in Canada and the States. Sir Edward Morris had a word of praise for the Institute and testimony to the need of such an institution and the good it could do was given by the Rev. W. T. D. Dunn, J. Browning, President of the St. Andrew's Association, and G. C. Feary, President of the Board of Trade. The benediction was pronounced by Rev. Mr. Sutherland at 11 o'clock and brought the dinner to a close.
