PARIS, Dec. 8.—(Official.) In the region of Arras a brilliant attack has given us possession, it is announced, of Vermelles and Routoire. Vermelles has been, for nearly two months, the scene of desperate fighting. The enemy had taken footing there on Oct. 16, and from the 21st to the 28th of October succeeded in forcing us back from that locality. From the 25th of October, sapping and mining operations brought us back, until we were again in close contact, and on Dec. 1st we occupied the Park Chateau of Vermelles.

In the region of the Aisne and in Champagne, there have been some artillery engagements, and our artillery dispersed several gatherings
