

During Monday evening and Tuesday morning the enemy delivered 'eight attacks on one of the heights north of Kaimo River; all were repulsed.

LANDED AT BALTIMORE. BALTIMORE, Jan. 10.

The captain and six men composing he crew of the British schr. Ewart Harris landed, here to-day from the British steamer Kelvin Brae which took the men off their vessel about seven hundred miles east of Newfoundland on New Year's Day. The Ewart Harris was abandoned rudderless and leaking badly. She was bound from Cadiz to St. John's with a cargo of salt.

#### ITALIAN DESTROYER SUNK.

BERLIN, Jan. 10. An Italian submarine destroyer was recently sunk off the Island of Corfu, according to a semi-official announcement by the Overseas News Agency to-day. The members of the Army Staff were on board the vessel, the statement adds, and seven naval officers and 333 army officers were killed.


