Hay, seconded by Mr. John Sheppard and carried unanimously: That a hearty vote of thanks be tendered to David Tompkins, Esq., the retiring President, for his services in connection with the association, and in the cause of Reform.

On motion made and seconded, it was resolved to hold the next annual meeting in Evans' hall, Mount Forest, on the first Tuesday in January, 1874. After three cheers for the Queen, and three for Col. Hinchinbath, the gathering dispersed.

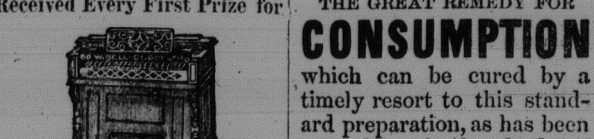
