Y.W.C.A. Shames Y.M.C.A. In Their Yearly Report

Should Soon Be Able to Wipe Out Debt, Says Mr. Hunt—Wants More Help and Less Criticism, Says Mrs. Kerby—National Secretary Outlines the Work in Other Countries

The Y.W.C.A. parlors were crowded last night with interested men and women gathered to hear the reports of the various branches of work for the year ending on April 30th.

The opening remarks were made by Miss Campbell who spoke of the good work done by the "Y," and thanked the president and board for all their attention and kindness.

50 Women Have Not Quarrelled. The president, in her address, said that the "Y" did not report any quarrels in the boarding house, there was a bigger record than in any other boarding house.

The average attendance in the main building, according to Miss Glass' statistics, was 49 per month and in the annex, 49 per month. 1183 transients had stayed during the year while 558 persons had been directed to other rooms.

Miss Saunders' Address. The guest of honor for the evening was Miss Saunders, the national secretary of the Y.W.C.A., and in her opening remarks she spoke of the great good always obtained by unity and co-operation.

Y.W.C.A. Work in Other Countries. In Cairo there was much work being done, Miss Saunders said, many European girls flocking into the city to business or to become governesses.

Y.W.C.A. Work in Bulgaria. Passing to Bulgaria she said that a "Y" had been founded there two years ago and had done much good. This had been the result of two women petitioning the "Y" conference in Berlin to found a "Y" in Bulgaria.

Y.W.C.A. Work in India. In India, the work was also tremendous. But Miss Saunders passed to Japan, where the girls are taking hold of western ideas in business and education.

Y.W.C.A. Work in the United States. They are employed in telephone exchanges, as ticket sellers at stations, and in banks and offices of all kinds.
