The following members of the executive were present: Colin Macdougall, Q.C., J. H. Coyne, M.A., Principal Austin, B.D., Principal Shepherd, Rev. J. G. Scott, president of the conference. The following ministers of London were present for advice and consultation: Dr. Anniff, Rev. Chas. Smith, Rev. W. Rigsby, Rev. C. E. McIntyre, Rev. Jos. Philip, B. D., Rev. Mr. Marshall, Rev. Mr. McVitty, Rev. Jas. Ward, B. A. Rev. J. G. Scott, president, was called to the chair. After devotional exercises by Rev. J. R. Gundy, the secretary of Alma College gave his report of circuits visited and results of his canvass to date. Some seven or eight of the weaker circuits were reported as canvassed and others partially. After long and thorough discussion it was, on motion of Rev. J. R. Gundy, seconded by Rev. J. W. Annis, resolved that a united and earnest effort be made to raise, within one year, at least \$25,000 in cash and subscriptions payable within four years for payment of the college debt.

It was then on motion resolved to distribute this amount over the various districts, and such apportionments were made.

The enrollment to date this year had reached 150; the receipts were in advance of any preceding year, and the work in all departments most encouraging.

The session, which lasted over three hours, was characterized by great earnestness and unanimity, and manifested leyal devotion to the college. The work of the financial secretary in the London district has been encouraging.
