Aggressive Attitude of Monopolies Towards U. S. Government.

## THE STEEL SEMI-PANIC

Threat to Smash Carnegie's Company Started Wild Time on Wall Street.

Washington, Sept. 27.—There is a story here tonight that a plan of compromising, or settling out of court, cases against the trusts, was forced by these combinations upon the president and the Attorney-General. In plain English, the trusts said to the Administration: If you carry on your programme of general assault on us we will plunge you and the country into a panic and beat your personal political game. The facts that the adherents of this story have to go on are these: When Philander C. Knox was attorney-general he made a speech at Pittsburgh in which he invented, or showed, the difference between good and bad or reasonable and unreasonable trusts. When the supreme court in the tobacco case adopted Mr. Knox's view it was the subject of remark at the White House.

## FLYING MACHINE WITHOUT PLANES

Rises From the Ground Without Taking a Run.

## LIGHTNING HITS CLOCK

News of Interest From Various Parts of England.

London, Sept. 28.—A wonderful planeless flying machine has been invented by Mr. Stoddart, of Egham, Kent. It is a flying machine which will not only fly forward (and backward) from the ground without any preliminary run. Mr. Stoddart has made 50 self-raising models of flying machines, but the planeless one is the latest and most satisfactory he has yet invented. He was led to experiment with this type of machine by watching the movements of the common house fly.

A pair of field glasses played a prominent part in the smart capture of three men who were remanded at Burslem recently in charges of burglary. Strange noises were heard by a workman at Highfields tileworks, and he found three men trying to break open a safe which they had moved from the office into the yard. The men ran away, but their flight was watched through field glasses. The local police were informed and telephoned to Burslem, where the men were caught.

Canon William Hector Lyon, who died a few days ago at Sherborne, Dorset, had the distinction of being the vicar of Sherborne Abbey in the Lady Chapel of which he was born in 1827, when the abbey was used as a dwelling-house. Before he retired he was almost totally blind, but regularly conducted the abbey service, his wonderful memory rarely failing him.

## WILEY WOULD BAR MARRIAGE OF WEAK

Radical Proposals of Famous American Pure Food Experts.

Kansas City, Mo., Sept. 27.—Harvey M. Wiley, of Washington, D. C., chief of the federal agricultural department, chemistry bureau, and exonerated star figure in the so-called Wiley pure food controversy, told the National Conservation Congress today that the health of the nation was worth \$500,000,000. He made this estimate on the basis of \$500 per capita, average annual earning of 45,000,000 wage-earning adults. This declaration was made in an address in which he advocated limitation of marriage to normal and healthy individuals, segregation of tubercular and typhoid fever patients, as in smallpox, yellow fever and leper cases; establishment of a national department of health, and rigid enforcement of pure food and drug laws.

Dr. Wiley said that "if in the remote future coal, iron, gold and silver should become extinct, science would provide substitutes," and that science would "secure the maintenance and increase of the wealth in forest, field and stream."

"But there is another natural asset," he continued, "lying at the very basis of the prosperity of the country which is sometimes overlooked, namely, the normal functioning of the human machine, commonly expressed by the term 'health.' This has more to do with the happiness, prosperity and utility of the human organism than any of the other natural assets which I have mentioned."

In order to unify the national and state activities making for the public health," he declared, "the establishment of a national department of health is almost a necessity. Do not be deterred by the cry which goes up of 'doctors' trust.' The wise physicians are in favor of such a department, not because it is a physicians' trust, but because it is for the good of the people."

Rape Selfish Doctor. "The selfish physician will be glad to see the present condition of affairs continue, because it tends to produce disease, and thus throws greater practice into his hands. The altruistic physician believes in prophylaxis rather than in therapeutics. He is willing to sacrifice his own income in his devotion to the public service."

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## OLD SOLDIER'S LUCK

Becomes Heir to \$2,000,000 Fortune in Canada.

London, Sept. 27.—An unexpected and big fortune has fallen to an old soldier, who since his retirement from the army has been employed as a humble commissionaire. Sergeant Major Thomas Smith, formerly of the Royal Monmouthshire Regiment, has just received news that under the will of a brother who died in Canada he has become heir to a fortune of \$2,000,000. About 25 years ago Smith's brother, Richard, left Devonport for Toronto, where he purchased land, on which he "struck oil" literally, and steadily accumulated wealth as an oil exporter.

He has left about \$1,000,000, the greater portion of which he has bequeathed to charities, but the fifth, amounting to about \$2,000,000, comes to his only brother, Thomas, who says he is not losing his head over the fortune left to him, but that he will merely retire to his old home in Devonport with his wife and five children, and spend the remainder of his life in peace and comfort.

## THE SENTINEL'S VIEW

## IMPORTANT JUDGMENT

Validity of Insurance Contracts Outside Province of Quebec.

Montreal, Sept. 28.—A judgment maintaining the validity of a contract written outside of the limits of the Province of Quebec, by a Province of Quebec Insurance Company, was rendered yesterday in the case of Kline Bros. vs. the Provincial Insurance Company. The plaintiffs, a tobacco manufacturing concern, sought recovery of \$1,000, the amount of a policy written by the company, and covering loss by fire to premises of the company in Florida. The plaintiffs represented that a policy for this amount had been entered into by the insurance company on Aug. 27, 1908, the contract being signed by a qualified representative of the company in New York. The defendant company opposed the suit on the grounds that, according to a clause of the contract, the policy was annulable at the wish of the company in a letter dated Dec. 22, 1908, declared its intention of annulling the contract, on the grounds that the company was not authorized by law to write such contracts outside of the limits of the Province of Quebec. The court maintained that the defendant had failed to establish that it was forbidden to do business outside of the Province of Quebec, and furthermore that it had failed to give adequate proof of the fact that it had annulled, or signified its intention of cancelling the contract.
