District Awaits Methodist ' Word of Safety From Their Missionary in Japan.

Much anxiety is felt in St. Thomas and surrounding district as to the fate of Rev. M. M. Whiting, representative of the Methodist Churches of this district in the stricken area of Japan, and although nothing definite has been heard, it is hoped that he was not in either of the cities destroyed, but on a summer vacation in the hills, where the damage and loss of life was much less than in the arger centers.

Although not a former resident of St. Thomas, Rev. Mr. Whiting was sent to Japan by the Methodist Conference as the representative of the district which has that city as its center, and therefore he is now lookd upon, more or less, as a citizen. Rev. Robert Hicks, Central Methodist Church, who knew Mr. Whiting personally, was out of town all day yesterday and could not be reached, but Rev. A. E. Moorehouse of Grace Church recollected him, and remembered having heard him speak before departing for the Orient.

"Rev. Mr. Whiting is a most able speaker," declared Mr. Moorehouse, and one who was highly thought of by all members of the Methodist conference. He spoke here about 15 years ago in Central Church, just prior to his going to Japan, and I heard him at that time. He gave a remarkable address. He returned here about five years ago, and spoke in the churches, but I was not here at that time so cannot say much about him. He was not a resident of St. Thomas, but allocated to the district by the conference. From reports that have been received here there is no doubt but that he was doing a won-derful work in Japana, and if he is among the dead his loss will be sev-erely felt. While we are extremely

anxious we are nevertheless hoping for the best."

Rev. W. Gaetz, First Methodist Church, also stated that Mr. Whiting was highly respected and performing a marvellous work in his foreign

home.
Fear is felt by the Anglicans of St. Thomas that representatives of that church in this district may also be in the danger area, although Rev. P. N. Harding, St. John's Church, stated that he did not know of any that came from that city direct.
"There are several Anglican missionaries in Japan." he stated, "headed by Bishop Hamilton, and we are afraid that several who have appeared in local churches at one time or another may be imperiled by the

or another may be imperiled by the tragic disasters which have been visited on that country."

Regarding the Presbyterian missions, Rev. A. E. Thornloe, Alma street Presbyterian Church, stated that none of their representatives was stationed near the earthquake area.

EXPRESS GRAVE FEARS FOR MISSIONARY IN JAPAN

Kitchener, Sept. 3.—Relatives and friends of Miss Evelyn Lackner of this city, a missionary of the Meth-odist Church in Japan, are expressing grave fears for her safety, as a result of the earthquake which has destroyed the Japanese city. Miss Lackner had been in the city for a month in the late spring, but left for Japan about a month ago, joining 18 other Canadian missionaries at North Bay. They sailed from Vancouver on the Empress of Canada, and it is feared they arrived in time to be involved in the earthquake.






