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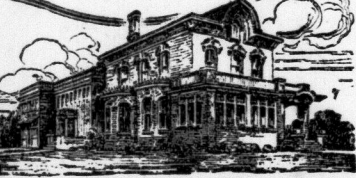

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REPUDIATE CLAIM OF COMMUNISTS

Vice-President of Federation Claims Reds Have No Influence.

Associated Press Despatch.
Liverpool, Oct. 2.—A vigorous denunciation of the Communists by Herbert Smith, vice-president of the Miners' federation, was the most important development of the closing session of the Parliamentary Labor conference today. Mr. Smith declared his confidence that the miners would never adopt Communism, and his declaration is looked upon as important, because the Communists had claimed they possess more influence with the miners than with the men of any other industry.

Ramsay MacDonald, the former Labor premier, expressed himself as thoroughly satisfied with the proceedings of the conference, saying he believed the attitude of the Socialist party in turning down Communist proposals would be a source of strength at the next elections, and would bring the party hundreds of thousands of votes.

The Parliamentary Labor conference began its sessions on September 29, and immediately passed resolutions by large majorities against admitting Communists to the party.

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LAMB SAYS HOPE IS IN IMMIGRATION

Claims Empire Settlement Commission, Non-Political, Necessary.

Ottawa, Oct. 2.—The present condition of affairs is a danger, a scandal and a reproach, not only to the statesmen but to the common sense of the British race. A people that does not make proper use of the heritage which is theirs is not worthy of it," emphatically declared Commissioner David Lamb of the Salvation Army, London, England, in the course of an address on emigration here today. Commissioner Lamb urged that an empire settlement corporation or commission is a necessity. This body should be composed of capable and experienced men, free from all political pressure. It would undertake all the work incidental to the selection, transportation and ultimate settlement of the migrants. Commissioner Lamb declared that the whole future of the British empire depends on the proper handling of its man-power.

He said that had there been no great catastrophe such as started in 1914 Canada would have had no railway problem, probably such as at present exists. The war stopped immigration in Canada, and that aggravated the railway problem. Commissioner Lamb remarked it is easy to be wise after the event, but the fact is nobody really foresaw that catastrophe, and its consequences as regards immigration in Canada. He pointed out that the war left the old country with a million and a quarter more population than there would have been had there been no war. Population in the old country is increasing at the present time at the rate of 1,000 per day.

N. B. AUTHORITIES THINK SHOOTING NOT ACCIDENT

Sussex, N. B., Oct. 2.—There have been no new developments today in the shooting fatality at South Branch, Kings county, yesterday, in which Gideon Clain was shot dead while working in the field near his home. The matter is surrounded with suspicious circumstances and the general belief is that the shooting was not accidental. The authorities working on the case decline to give out any further information, prior to the holding of the inquest.

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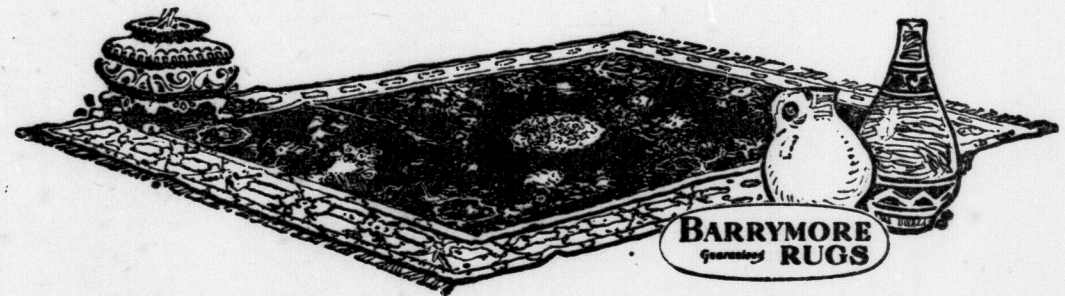

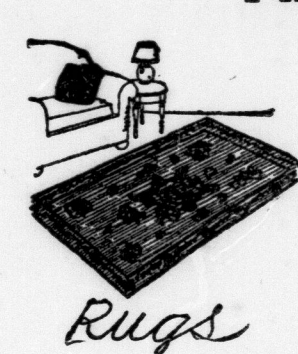

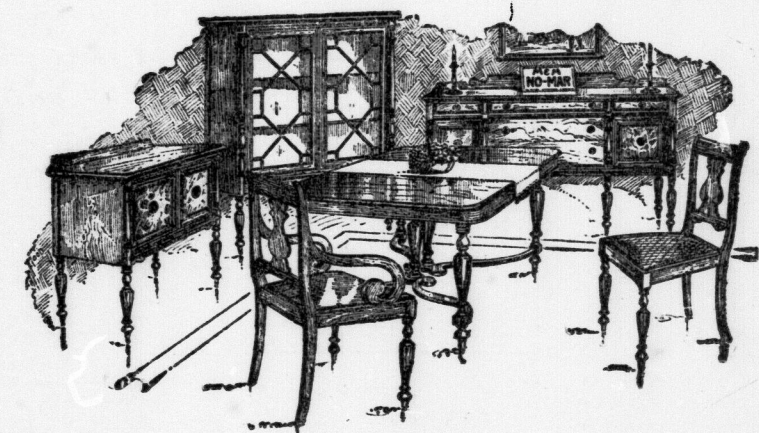
