SATISFACTORY SHOWING AT THE ANNUAL MEETING.

Names of the Gentlemen Who Will Make the Trans-Atlantic Trip—Whitely in the "Yankee" Curling Competition—General News of the Club.

The annual report was submitted, showing that the season of 1886 was most successful. The number of matches played was 28, of which 20 were won and 8 lost. Owing to the other engagements of some of the club members the Ottawa and Montreal matches fell through for which the committee was commended. There was a noticeable increase in the membership of the club and a laudable accession to the success of the club, which deserve every encouragement.

The number of games allowed them on the grounds has been increased for the year. It was regretted that the club was not able to play the Australians to turn up. The club is also indebted to Messrs.
