

AT GOOD WILLE'S GROVE.

OPENING OF THE FIFTH PROHIBITION CAMP NEAR GEORGETOWN.

All the Countrymen Present to Listen to Talks on Temperance by Well-known Speakers. The opening of the fifth prohibition camp near Georgetown, Ontario, was held on Saturday morning.

For five years Georgetown has held a "Prohibition Camp." The attendance here has been large, the speakers of more than local repute, and an aggressive spirit has been stirred up among the sworn enemies of the drink traffic.

The camp is on the outskirts of the village, on a wooded rising ground, bearing the appropriate name of "Good Wille's Grove." The designation speaks of sobriety, earnestness and plainness, according to the moral standpoint of the camp.
