While the crop conditions in Britain have improved, the European and American crops are reported much smaller, while in Canada, according to the latest report of the Fruit Division, Department of Agriculture, Ottawa, the prospect for apples has declined seriously for the early and fall sorts, the indications being for an average crop of winter fruit. A fair crop of peaches is promised, but in case of pears there has been an almost unnsual reduction in prospects and plums are less encouraging than they were a month ago. Outside of Southern Ontario and British Columbia the grape crop has been reported as likethe grape crop has been reported as likely to ripen imperfectly, and even in the more favored districts weather conditions may yet greatly affect the output. Farmmay yet greatly affect the output. Farmers, as well as those who make fruit-growing a specialty, are therefore well advised in husbanding the crop with very great care and looking for high prices in contracting deliveries ahead,—Farmers' Advocate

Kettle Point Indians Will Get Some Money.

Last week Sarnia had the honor of a visit from three gentlemen from the other side of the lines, of much note in their respective communities and whose presence in Sarnia was in course of the presence in Sarnia was in course of the prosecution of a very curious and interesting inquiry, and an inquiry moreover, which it is hoped may ultimately result in much pecuniary benefit to the parties concerned. The members of the party were Dr. Wooster, a big official of the Bureau of Indian Affairs at Washington, Rev. E. Morested a clergyman of Bark Rev. E. Morested, a clergyman of Bark River, Wisconsin, and Mr. Charles Pak-echo chief of the Pottawatomic Indians, of Green Bay, Wisconsin. The Misiness which brought the three gentlemen to Sarnia was to make inquiry as to whether any, and if any, how many of the Chip-pawas of the Sarnia band were entitled to a share of the proceeds of what is known a share of the proceeds of what is known in political circles in Washington as the great Pottawatomie land claim. In all, the commission obtained an en-

rollment at Sarma of 117 persons with undoubted claims to share in the distri-bution of the avails of the Wisconsin land claim—that is, of course if the distribution ever comes to be made. Of these, thirty-three are resident on the Sarnia Reserve, and eighty-four on the reserves at Kettle Point and Stoney Point.

Blended Flour

Modern farming has become a business Modern farming has become a business proposition, and men engage in agriculture because it returns annual profits on the money and labor invested. The soil is the paymaster, and the variety, quantity, and quality of goods produced, determines the success of the man engaged in the agricultural business.

But the market must be considered.

But the market must be considered and demand must be created and catered to, if business is to advance. Unfortun-ately for Outario farmers, the demand for what ought to be the most valuable pro-duct of their fields has declined. Western duct of their fields has declined. Western millers have introduced a flour which, though lacking in flavor, contains more "strength," or gluten, than that which is milled from the more finely flavored Ontario wheat, Ontario consumers, by the extensive advertising of the alleged superiority of Western flour, were soon convinced that flavor must be sacrificed to strength, so the home market was largely lost, and farmers began to notice the increased cost of feed, and the low prices to be obtained for their wheat.

By a series of chemical analyses and

By a series of chemical analyses and experiments which have extended over a experiments which have extended over a decade, it has been demonstrated that by the addition of a small proportion of Western wheat. Ontario blended flour contains the necessary gluten to successfully compete with its Western rival, and Still retain the flavor which is peculiar to Ontario grain. Bread made from blended flour soon found a ready sale in Toronto, and within a year or two after the introduction of blended flours on the market, the Maritime Provinces have shown such preference for these Ontario-milled flours that certain milling firms have doubled their plants in the last six

It has been already pointed out that the farmer as a business man, must con-sider the market and the inexorable law of supply and demand. Now Ontario ought to deserve the first attention, and the home-market of the Province should feel the effect of the demand for Ontario

blended flour.

But the farmer is both a producer and a consumer, and as such, has a double interest in helping to create a demand for Ontario grown wheat. When the individual farmer realizes that the ourchase of the new flour means better bread on his table, better prices for his wheat, and an ultimate substantial decrease in the cost of bran and shorts, the battle to regain the Ontario market for an Ontario product will be as good as won. product will be as good as won.
