Barren's Wax Factory.—We understand that Mr. S. F. Benjamin, White Birch Mills, has started at this place a barrel and box factory for the putting up of apples and plums, etc. He has put in improved machinery, and is able to turn out 100 barrels a day, besides boxes. It is allowed by those most competent of judging, that these barrels and boxes are fully up to the standard—in fact are superior to most that are now made. They are just the thing for shipping apples to foreign markets. Next year Mr. Benjamin intends putting in machinery that will turn out at least 50,000 barrels, saying nothing of boxes which he can furnish to an unlimited extent.—Harrisburgh Chronicle.

The Coming Week.—Wealth in Black Birch. It is said that the supply of black walnuts is gradually becoming exhausted, and a substitute is being looked for. The general impression in Ontario is that black birch is the coming wood. It is close-grained, and handsome, and can be easily stained to resemble walnut exactly, and besides being very durable is suitable for all the purposes for which walnut is used. It is susceptible of a beautiful polish equal to any wood in use. The price of this wood is already advancing, and Canadian foresters are likely to realize for the people a very handsome amount. It is said to be difficult to get to the saw mills by water, as it is so heavy that it will sink after being a few days in the water, which is a slight drawback, but as a means to remedy this it is bound together with pine logs, if pine is handy to it.—Fredericton Reporter.

London, Aug. 27.—The speech from the throne on the Prorogation of Parliament, declares that the relations with foreign powers are amicable and cordial, satisfactory assurances are received from France regarding Tunis, and the government has been secured to Transvaal, which it is hoped will tranquillize South Africa. The withdrawal of British troops from Afghanistan is not expected to lead to any trouble on the north-western frontier of India. Although negotiations have been temporarily suspended, the best efforts will be made to conclude commercial treaty with France. In reference to Irish affairs the Queen says it is her earnest hope that the new Land Act may be productive of benefits commensurate with the care given to the measure. It has been the study of Her Majesty, to use the exceptions and powers conferred to her in Ireland, with vigilance and firmness, but with discrimination. The desire is expressed that the condition of the country will so improve that the use of these extraordinary powers may be dispensed with at least.

Personal Appearance of the Wounded. New York, Aug. 24.—The Secretary of State views the case in saying that the patient fails to regain strength. Possibly Mr. Blaine will not feel warranted in his statements after consultation with the physicians present. It is asserted that the President has gained some little strength from the liquid nourishment he has taken during the past few days. But it is certain that the signs of returning strength are very slight. I know that last night Mr. Blaine was utterly dependent, and his melancholy was shared by other members of the Cabinet. It must seem even to Dr. Bliss, who is the most sanguine of the physicians, that it is a gigantic task to restore the President to health. None of the reports of his feeble condition are exaggerated. A large, strong man, in health neglected about 210 pounds, he is now in reality a living skeleton. The outward signs of his extreme emaciation do not affect

those who have seen him constantly since he was shot, but he would scarcely be recognized by those who knew him well before July 2. There is very little flesh on the body. The bones protrude. The eyes are swollen, cheeks hollow and skin drawn over the face, parchments. Mrs. D. E. Blaine has a personal drama, says that the President's forehead is not thicker than his wrist was before he was injured. The stomach of the sick man is as capricious as the stomach of an infant. No one can tell at what moment it will refuse even the liquid nourishment which it now retains, and upon the operation of this organ the life of the sick man depends. There is another danger threatening which may or may not be averted. This danger is suppuration of the swollen parotid gland. While the physicians hope that the swelling may be reduced without suppuration there are many indications to present that their hope will not be realized. If the swelling suppurates and is lanced the experience of the past indicates that it will be attended with another derangement of the stomach. The physicians are certainly engaged in a desperate fight, with large odds against them, and they will deserve all praise if they win.
