The proof of the intoxicating properties of this beer is difficult and expensive at present, because the analyst who tests it must be subpoened to give his evidence at the trial. In two cases tried before Stipendiary Hervey at Round Hill the expenses and fees paid to the Halifax analyst amount to \$28.25.
