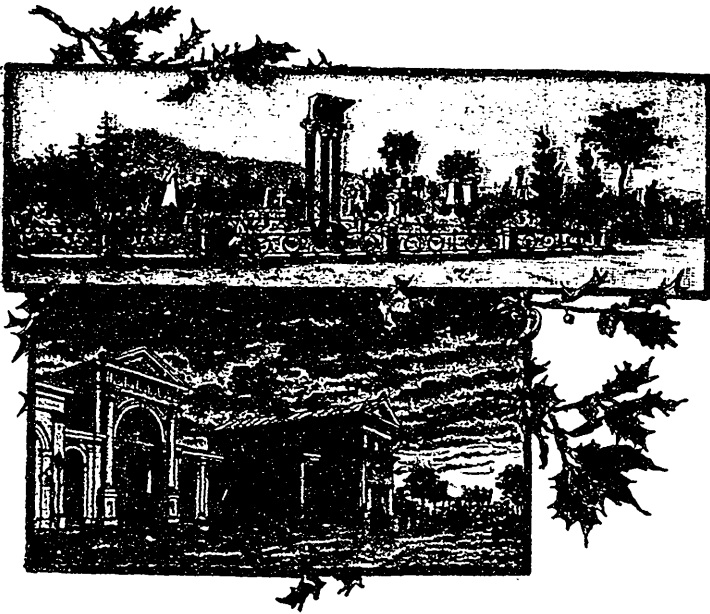

In modern religious history the name of Zurich is of no small importance, for here movements began whose influences were felt far and wide.
