Market Report

VICTORIA, Nov. 14th, 1862.

Under a new management, this report will, henceforward, be issued twice per month.

A sternwheel steambot the "Reliance," was launched in this harbor on the 3d ult. She is intended for the Fraser River trade, and is the tenth steamer built in this port.

The arrivals of the miners from British Columbia during the last month, have been very numerous. It is impossible to arrive at a correct estimate of the aggregate quantity of gold dust brought down by them, but it is believed that the yield is greater than that of last year.

A new stimulus to mining in Cariboo will be created next spring by the greater facility of traveling and much reduced distance by the Bate Inlet route, a trail through which has been opened, and a wagon road will be made in the spring.

The up-country trade is closed for the season. Trade through the winter will be confined to the local and neighboring markets, including those in British Columbia. A trade is springing up between this port and Washington Territory, which will probably increase. Our market is at present well supplied with most descriptions of goods, and, with few exceptions, trade continues good, supplies meeting with a steady demand.

Much more gold is retained in the country than was the case last year, and the resident population of this town and colony is rapidly increasing.

BOOTS & SHOES—Women and childrens' in demand, other kinds, English, overstocked

CRUCKLEY—Few sales, but at a moderate advance on cost.

CANDLES—Improved inquiry.

COFFEE—Dull, Costa Rica and Rio in demand.

DRY GOODS—Good demand, and selling freely at advanced rates.

FLOUR—Has declined in value owing to large arrivals and lower prices in San Francisco.

FRUITS, JAMS, &c.—In little demand.

NAVAL STORES—Stocks light; pitch, tar, rosin and turpentine in demand at advanced rates; also hemp and cotton canvas.

LUMBER—In demand, 1 in. boards and 1 1/2 in plank and flooring in much demand. Prices generally have advanced about 2 1/2 in the last fortnight, but recent heavy supplies will probably cause a reaction.

MATCHES—Little demand, fair stock on hand.

OILS—Dogfish in demand at enhancing value.

PROVISIONS—Butter, Isthmus in good demand.

LARD—Dull.

CHEESE—English, in limited demand.

BACON—No Oregon in market.

PORK—Good demand.

SOAP—Very heavy, large lots have been forced off at auction, but for finer qualities a steady sale.

SYRUP & MOLASSES—Large stock and no demand.

SPIRITS—Supply large, but stock now being moved at fair rates.

TOBACCO—Stock moderate; demand steady; cigars in fair demand, stock of Manila limited.

TEA—Good demand for fine qualities for local consumption.

WINES—Sherry, stock light, with good inquiry.

MALT LIQUORS—Sales large on the spot; and to arrive at full rates.

YEAST POWDER—Good consumption at full prices
