SUPPLEMENTARY AGREEMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF ITALY CONCERNING THE SALE IN ITALY OF WASTE MATERIAL AND SCRAP BELONGING TO THE ROYAL CANADIAN AIR FORCE, SIGNED IN ROME ON THE 18th OF DECEMBER 1961⁽¹⁾

THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF ITALY:

having examined the desirability of expanding the scope of the Italo-Canadian scrap disposal Agreement of December 18th, 1961 to include the disposal of surplus material by the Royal Canadian Air Force in Italy, have agreed as follows:

Article I

The Royal Canadian Air Force will inform the Italian Government of the quality, quantity, value, location and proposed point of sale of surplus material which it wishes to sell to individuals, firms or other entities authorized to transact business in Italy.

Article II

The Italian Government will consider on a case by case basis the desirability of authorizing the importation of this material in whole or in part.

Article III

The Italian Government will have the option of purchasing, at prices to be agreed, surplus material put up for sale in Italy by the Royal Canadian Air Force. If the Italian Government does not exercise this option within 60 days of the date of notification by the RCAF that the material is for sale, the Royal Canadian Air Force will have the right to sell the material to individuals, firms or other entities in the manner envisaged by this agreement.

Article IV

On request, the Italian Air Force will act as agent for the Royal Canadian Air Force in the sale of surplus material in Italy. These sales will be carried out in accordance with the principles which normally govern the sale of goods belonging to the Italian Government. Detailed arrangements as necessary will be agreed upon by the Italian Air Force and the Royal Canadian Air Force.

Article V

The importation of surplus material will remain subject to the issuance of an import license which must be requested from the Italian Government in each case by the purchaser. The Royal Canadian Air Force will not deliver material until the purchaser produces evidence that he has satisfied Italian Customs regulations.
