

Mr. Murphy, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, of the 7th February, 1934, for a copy of Order in Council, if any, dealing with unemployment relief of permanent park residents in Prince Albert National Park.

And also,—Return to an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, of the 7th February, 1934, for a copy of Order in Council P.C. 2358, 1932, and P.C. 52, 1933, and any other Orders in Council, in connection with unemployment relief of single homeless men in Prince Albert National Park.

Mr. Gordon, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copies of Orders in Council passed under the Relief Act, 1932, and the Relief Act, 1933, as follows:—

Order in Council, P.C. 273, dated 12th February, 1934: authorizing payment to the Province of Quebec of the sum of \$8,657.84 for direct relief.

Order in Council, P.C. 274, dated 12th February, 1934: authorizing payment to the Province of Quebec of the sum of \$407,294.04 for municipal direct relief.

Order in Council, P.C. 275, dated 12th February, 1934: authorizing payment to the Province of Quebec of the sum of \$18,075.90 for direct relief and municipal works.

Order in Council, P.C. 276, dated 12th February, 1934: crediting the sum of \$185,831.28 to loans made to the Province of British Columbia for municipal direct relief, provincial direct relief in unorganized municipalities, in disorganized or bankrupt municipalities and for transient families.

On motion of Mr. Stevens, the First Report of the Special Committee appointed to enquire into Price Spreads and Mass Buying was concurred in.

The following Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers under subsection 4 of Standing Order 44:—

By Mr. Euler:—Order of the House for a Return showing what guarantees or loans or grants were made in the years 1931, 1932, 1933, and 1934, to persons, or private concerns or corporations.

Mr. Rhodes, a Member of the King's Privy Council, presented,—Return to the foregoing Order forthwith.

By Mr. Neill:—Order of the House for a Return showing:—

1. The names of all ship owners, or shipping companies, receiving during the calendar year 1933 from the Dominion Government payment for services originating either in Vancouver or Victoria, British Columbia, whether subsidized for a distinct service or receiving payment for carrying mail either on a flat rate or so much per unit.

2. The amount paid to each company.

3. Whether any of these owners or companies are required by the terms of their contracts to use British Columbia coal on their boats. If so, which, and whether they have adhered to such condition.
