

The Honourable Mr. Dandurand laid upon the Table:—

Statement of all Bonds and Securities Registered in the Department of the Secretary of State of Canada, since last return submitted to the Parliament of Canada, under section 32 of chapter 19, of The Revised Statutes of Canada, 1906 (31st January, 1925).
