In 1922 the premium on the select bacon grade was established by agreement between the department and the joint swine committee, the membership of which includes representatives of various producers organizations.

Mr. GARDINER: That is not a committee set up by the government.

Mr. HANSON (York-Sunbury): Oh, well-

Mr. GARDINER: I understood the committee referred to was a government committee.

Mr. HANSON (York-Sunbury): Any alibi will do!

Mr. GARDINER: If there is such a committee I will try to get the names, but I do not think we have them on the list.
