PRAYERS.

One Petition was laid on the Table.

The Clerk of the House laid upon the Table the Fourth Report of the Clerk of Petitions, stating that he had examined the Petition presented on the 19th instant, and finds that all the requirements of Standing Order 68 have been complied with. The said Petition was then read and received and is as follows:—

Of the Montreal and Atlantic Railway Company; praying for the passing of an Act to amend its Act of Incorporation by increasing its borrowing powers.—*Mr. Pickel.*

Mr. Manion, a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Report of Work done and Expenditures made to August 31st, 1930; also during the calendar year 1930, in connection with Acts (chapter 45 of 17 George V; chapter 31 of 19-20 George V; chapters 12 to 26 inclusive of 17 George V; chapter 23 of 19-20 George V; and chapters 18 to 22 inclusive, chapters 24 to 30 inclusive and chapters 32 to 36 inclusive of 19-20 George V); respecting construction of Canadian National Railway Lines.

The following Bills were, by leave of the House, respectively introduced, read the first time, and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House, viz:—

Bill No. 10, An Act to amend the Canada Evidence Act—*Mr. Guthrie.*

Bill No. 11, An Act to amend the Ticket of Leave Act.—*Mr. Guthrie.*

The House resumed the adjourned Debate on the proposed motion of Mr. Cormier, for an Address to His Excellency the Administrator, in answer to His Speech at the opening of the Session, and the proposed motion of Mr. Mackenzie King in amendment thereto.

And the Debate continuing, the said Debate was, on motion of Mr. Casgrain, adjourned.

The House then adjourned at 5.50 o'clock, p.m., until Monday next, at 3 o'clock, p.m.
