

were adopted, it might involve postponing the Bar examination until the completion of clerkship and, possibly, some alteration in the nature of the examination, which might be made to turn on the more practical side of the student's training, depending upon the Universities to test and grade theoretical qualifications.

The Faculty desired me to add to the statement of these views an expression of our willingness to discuss with the Bar Council, at its convenience, any or all of the questions involved in the proposed change.
