

If desired, in place of putting the reception at foot of invitation, it is correct form to send a separate card, enclosed with the others, reading thus :

*Mr. and Mrs. Charles E. Evans*  
*request the pleasure of your presence*  
*On Wednesday Evening, June thirteenth,*  
*at half past eight o'clock,*  
*808 Sherbrooke Street.*

When the wedding is quiet at home, followed by a reception in the evening, the invitation is worded thus :

*Mr. and Mrs. Charles E. Evans*  
*request your presence*  
*at the wedding reception of their daughter,*  
*Dorothy May,*  
*and*  
*Mr. Ernest A. Morrison,*  
*On Wednesday evening, June thirteenth,*  
*Nineteen hundred and three,*  
*at eight o'clock,*  
*808 Sherbrooke Street,*  
*Montreal.*
