Picnic Grounds

These grounds are far enough removed from the Lake View House and the cottages as to insure perfect quiet for those who wish it. For those who care to mingle in the crowds which visit these grounds, a day of keen enjoyment is possible. Picnics at Grimsby Beach are different from picnics elsewhere. Everyone seems to be enjoying the outing and there is a general feeling of good-fellowship and keen delight. The sale of liquor is prohibited on the grounds and there is no rough element or unseemly conduct. Just the true Canadian spirit of kindness, and a desire to get the most of a day's outing in the woods and on the beach of glorious Lake Ontario.
