## Riddell: Digby and His Powder.

This foul mess applied to the wound, the surgeons firmly believed had much virtue; but the result of such an application can be contemplated only with a shudder by one trained in the ultracleanly methods of modern surgery. In Digby's method there was no topical application to the wound; all that was done to it, was to wash it carefully from time to time with fair clean water, cover it with a clean, soft linen cloth, and cleanse it once a day from pus and other impurities—the purer the water, the cleaner the cloth, the better. And the beneficial result which Digby referred to the vitriol followed from vis medicatrix Natura, old Dame Nature's own remedy.
