quantity of falt and of the herbs of your garden, to give a better relish to their Goussou, which is a dish made of the meal of rice or maiz soaked in broth.

If you have any old negro, or one in weak health, employ him in fishing both for your-felf and your negroes. His labour will be well worth his subsistence.

It is moreover for your own interest to give your negroes a small piece of waste ground to improve at the end of your own, and to engage them to cultivate it for their own profit, that they may be able to dress a little better. by felling the produce of it, which you ought to buy from them upon fair and just terms, It were better that they should employ thema felves in cultivating that field on Sundays, when they are not Christians, than do worle. In a word nothing is more to be dreaded than to fee the negroes assemble together on Sundays, since, under pretence of Calinda or the dance, they fometimes get together to the number of three or four hundred, and make a kind of Sabbath, which it is always prudent to avoid; for it is in those tumultuous meetings, that they felly what they have stolen to one another, and com-
