- 3. Glycimeris siligua, Lam.—Narrows. 4 dead specimens in fair condition.
- 4. Mya arenaria, Linné—Harbour. Young, common; old ones, rarer.
- 5. Mya truncata, L.—Harbour. Young, common; old ones, rarer.
- 6. Thracia iruncata, Brown, (myopsis, Beck)—
 Narrows. 5 young and 1 old
 dead specimens.
- 7. Montacuta Dawsoni, Jeffr.—Harbour. Locally pretty plentiful.
