1. *Solen Americanus*, Gould—Harbour of St. John's.  
1 dead Specimen in  
good preservation.
2. *Solecurtus gibbus*, Spengler—Harbour of St. John's.  
A few young individuals.
3. *Glycimeris siligua*, Lam.—Narrows. 4 dead specimens in fair condition.
4. *Mya arenaria*, Linné—Harbour. Young, common;  
old ones, rarer.
5. *Mya truncata*, L.—Harbour. Young, common;  
old ones, rarer.
6. *Thracia truncata*, Brown, (*myopsis*, Beck)—  
Narrows. 5 young and 1 old  
dead specimens.
7. *Montacuta Dawsoni*, Jeffr.—Harbour. Locally  
pretty plentiful.
