Revivalist Torrey Scores the Critics

—He Hates Easy Ways of

Converting.

With the Torrey-Alexander meeting

held last night there was marked

practically the ending of the third week's

campaign in Toronto. It is announced

that this far 2800 cards of professing

converts have been received by Dr.

Torrey. This includes 775 children,

who came forward at yesterday's fore-

noon special meeting and the other

meeting converts of the previous

evening, making about 1000 to all or

more than half the total number. It

includes also the number drawn to

the front last night, about forty.

Speaking generally on the theme of

Torrey said: "If anyone believed in

Jesus he would believe in every one

of His words. It might be difficult

impossible, but true faith would in-

spire belief against the world. There

were lots of people who were willing

to accept the contentions of German

scholars as against the words of Jesus.

"I am here to affirm that such men

do not believe in the Lord Jesus,"

said Dr. Torrey.

Commenting on the fact that several

persons rose to leave the hall at the

point, Dr. Torrey said: "I am not

interested in seeing some of you

go, but I am interested in seeing

you get into the Kingdom of God.

The speaker said that complaint had

been made that in calling upon

converts to stand up, he made the

"I have a way," he said, "I want

reality. If you are not a convert

you are a Christian, you will be

able to make written professions

of faith and slip the card back to the
