THE POSTAL ARRANGEMENT

Which Has Been Made for the Klondike Region.

THERE IS A LITTLE TROUBLE

In the Minds of Some as to Whether the Scheme Will Work.

Mr. Mulock Accepts the Proposition to Carry the Mails to Circle City—The Customs Department Finds That There is Discrimination in Favor of Americans Over Canadian—Engineer J. J. McKeown is Going Up to Fairbanks Report.

Ottawa, Aug. 20.—In connection with the international postal agreement, the full text of the American Government, as proposed, has not yet been received. The proposition was made by the Postmaster-General here to the Postmaster-General at Washington, and the negotiations have been carried on between these two officials throughout.

The American Government submitted two propositions in reply, viz.: That either the American authorities would carry the Canadian mails, or the Canadian authorities should carry the mails to Circle City.

Hon. Wm. Mulock preferred the latter, which will be carried out. There is some feeling of misgiving on the part of some of the ministers in the matter, as to whether the arrangement is one of discrimination in favor of Americans.

The American Government is receiving numerous complaints of the working of the postal service. The American authorities are said to be giving preference to American passengers, freight and vessels over Canadian ones.

The Canadian customs officers have established a custom house at the arm between Tagish and Bennett Lakes, and are inspecting all miners' supplies entering the Northwest Territory. Duty is not exacted on ordinary and necessary supplies, consisting of plain, common food and clothing, weighing 1000 pounds or less.

From 0 to 30 persons in large boats have been carried on between these two points in the last few days. Provisions on the coast with from 800 to 1200 pounds of supplies are being landed here by the coasters.
