

TO TAKE OVER CENTRE STAR.

First Canadian Michipicoton Company.

Bank of Commerce at Dawson City—Mining Revival at Deloro in Hastings County—Reports of Progress of Leading Rossland Mines—Camp McKinney Excitement—Stocks.

This morning Mr. T. G. Blackstock leaves for Rossland to take over the Centre Star mine. The signatures of all the former shareholders to the deed of transfer have now been obtained, and the legal consummation of the deal is practically completed.

Klondike Gold. The \$200,000 shipment of Klondike gold spoken of in yesterday's World as having arrived at Seattle, Wash., for the Bank of Commerce, is the fourth shipment brought out of the Yukon since that institution established a branch in that city.

Camp McKinney Sensation. Word reached the city last night that Camp McKinney, B. C., has been thrown into excitement by a wonderfully rich discovery of free gold.

Michipicoton Gold. Toronto Company is Formed to Open Up the New Field. One of the important announcements of the week is the floating of a new mining company to operate in the new Michipicoton gold fields, the rich finds in which awakened such widespread interest.

According to the prospectus, it is the purpose of the company to develop two groups of free milling gold properties, situated upon the shores of Lake Wawa.

Victory-Triumph, Monte Cristo, White Bear. Stocks Bought and Sold on Commission. Canadian Gold Fields Are to Re-build Their Deloro Mill.

Prof. Montgomery of Trinity University has just returned from a week's sojourn in the mining districts of Hastings County, where he has been examining gold and iron properties on behalf of investors.

Herald we learn that already material is being hauled on the ground for the erection of a new mill, not on the old site, but in closer proximity to the shaft.

In the same connection, The Belleville Intelligencer says: "We have also been informed from a thoroughly reliable source that Mr. A. J. G. Swinney, formerly superintendent for the Canadian Gold Fields, will soon return to Marmora and start operations on his property, of which he owns some 1500 or 2000 acres.

Judge McDougall Visits White Bear—Plant for Deer Park. Judge McDougall has just returned from a visit to Rossland, where he spent three or four days looking over the prominent mines of that camp, among them the White Bear, in which the Judge is peculiarly interested.

He was very much impressed with the development work going on in the large producing mines, and he says that the White Bear is now looked upon in the camp as a mine of very great promise, although the principal development work done has been the sinking of a shaft 210 feet, and some drifting at the 100-foot and 165-foot levels.

Continuing, Judge McDougall said that he found the plant in good order and capable of working the mine to a depth of 400 feet. He says that when this depth is reached a large plant will be required, they are expected as from other developed mines on the Red Mountain.

Deer Park Plant. Mr. Melfort Boulton, secretary of the Deer Park, signed a contract yesterday with the Ingersoll-Sergant people of Montreal for the new compressor plant to be put in that mine.
