Ottawa, Sept. 18.—The total arrivals of immigrants at the ocean ports of Canada for the year ending June 30 last numbered 31,162, of whom 2782 were returned Canadas; that is, Canadians back from a trip to Europe, and 205 tourists. The immigrants from the United States to Canada approximately numbered between 16,000 and 18,000 persons, as compared with 15, 500 last year.
