TO MEET STRIKERS; **CROWD AND POLICE** IN FATAL BATTLE Kaiser's Chancellor Will Not Discuss Differ-

London, Feb. 1 .- While many thousands of workers are still on strike Berlin and other parts of Germany, the strike movement appears to be no longer in the process of extension, even in the capital. Repressive measures in Berlin have taken the form of the seizure of the trade union building by the police, and the arrest of several of the labor leaders.
