CANADA CEMENTS FRIENDSHIP'S BOND

Link Between Britain and U. S. New York Canadian Club Told.

New York, Nov. 12.—The position of Canada as the link which holds firm the bonds of friendship between Great Britain and the United States was emphasized by Sir Auckland Geddes, British ambassador at Washington, in an eloquent speech delivered at a dinner given in his honor by the Canadian Club of New York at the Hotel Biltmore tonight.

Canada has by force of circumstances the duty and privilege of being the interpreter of Britain to the United States and of the United States to Britain, said Sir Auckland, Canada's great deeds and achievements having predestined her to be the leader in securing cordiality between her partners and her neighbors. In a glowing tribute to the Dominion, he declared that Canada could not fail in this great task. "Read the manner of men the Canadians are," he said, "and you will never associate the idea of failure with their national effort."

After sketching the chaotic condition of the world as a result of the war and presenting an optimistic prediction regarding the possibility of recovery from the havoc that had been wrought, the ambassador remarked that a return to formal conditions was contingent upon the establishment and maintenance of a proper international understanding. To live at peace in a spirit of war as the world lived from 1900 to 1914 would not be enough. "We must have world peace and the spirit of peace between the nations, or humanity's convalescence may be indefinitely delayed," he said.

BRITISH JOURNALISTS AMBUSHED IN IRELAND

Dublin, Nov. 12.—A party of five British journalists and photographers, who are touring Southern Ireland as guests of the Royal Irish Constabulary, were ambushed this afternoon between Castle Is-lorry. The journalists' car was followed by a lorry of policemen, who, according to Dublin Castle, fired upon the attacking party, killing two men and making prisoners of seven others, some of whom were wounded. HUNGER STRIKERS CALL STRIKE OFF

Are Now Taking Nourishment and Ultimate Recovery Is Expected.

Cork, Nov. 12.—Following a message from Arthur Griffiths, Sinn Féin founder, stating the opinion that the hunger strikers in Cork prison had sufficiently testified their devotion to Ireland, backed up by an appeal last night from Bishop Cullen, of Cork, to the effect that a continuation of the strike would only be a waste of lives, the nine men who have now fasted for ninety-four days, consented today to take nourishment, and the hunger strike is over.

Nourishment is being administered to the nine men, it was stated at the prison this evening.

Such nourishment as suits their prostrate condition is being given the men and hope is entertained for their recovery.

The hunger strikers agreed to take food after the message of Mr. Griffith had been conveyed to them.

"It will be anxious work, but we are quite capable of pulling all the men thru," said Dr. Pearson of the Associated Press today. "The first nourishment will consist of infant's food, the eggs and beef juice. We are feeling out with each case and the outlook is bright."

Dr. Pearson denied reports that the prisoners began to take food several days ago. He declared they had nothing whatever to eat until today. Some of the strikers at first showed reluctance to comply with Mr. Griffith's advice to cease their fast, but all of them finally consented.

The cessation of the strike created little surprise here, in view of the efforts begun last week by the bishop of Cork to end it.
