

pended upon himself alone. We look forward to the time of self-support with hope and confidence, as to a period of renewed life and activity.

Under the present circumstances of our Church, the executive committee have thought that the resources of the Society should be husbanded as much as possible. They have, therefore, refrained from extending its operations as far as might otherwise have been done. They have reason to think that this Society is every year more appreciated by Churchmen; and that its objects, general and special, are well calculated to call forth and guide the exertions of all in unity and brotherly emulation.

From the returns for the year 1863, the committee observe with pleasure that more care has been taken to enrol the Sunday-school children as members of the Society. They are confident that hereafter the good fruits of such training will fully appear.

They have the satisfaction of stating that there is a probability of a little increase of income in 1863; since the contributions from the parishes are generally larger than in last year, although there are some, where owing to changes and vacancies, no collections have been made.

The income for general purposes is a little more than that of the year 1861. The amount received during 1862 from the subscribers to the D.C.S. was \$4251.64, which should correspond with the lists published in the last Report. From this amount the sum of \$679.35 was reserved by the parishes toward their several Endowments, leaving \$3572.29 at the disposal of the Executive Committee during 1862, for the general purposes of the Society.

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
