Its sanitary condition

This institution, founded in 1875 and incorporated by an Act of the Provincial Parliament in 1879, is delightfully located at the confluence of the St Francis and Magog rivers. Its commanding position in the centre of Sherbrooke, the metropolis of the Eastern Townships of Canada, gives it all the benefits of country atmosphere and aspect with the conveniences of city life. Nor are the appendages and interior of the establishment less conducive to health than the salubrity of the climate. Extensive grounds and a spacious recreation hall afford every desirable facility for youthful exercise and amusement.

The study hall has been refitted with desks and seats made on a pattern especially drawn for the Seminary by experienced men. They are perfectly noiseless and being made with highly polished ash and black⁷ walnut, they combine all the advantages of solidity, elegance, comfort, and commodity. Nothing superior in that line has ever been put on the market.

Sherbrooke being the convergent point of numerous railways, viz: 1o the Grand Trunk, 2o the Boston & Maine, (*Passumpsic division*), 3o the Quebec Central, 4o the Canadian Pacific railway,—has immense facilities of communication with all part of Canada and the United States.
