**MUST RAISE \$10,000,000**

Amount Needed From United States, Says Henry Morgenthau, to Save 3,000,000 Jews From Starvation

New York, March 23—Henry Morgenthau of the American Jewish relief committee announced here that \$10,000,000 must be raised in the United States by June 1 if the 3,000,000 Jews in the Eastern war zone are to be saved from starvation.

Mass meetings are to be held in the principal cities in every state and prominent Jews will make coast to coast trips to address these campaigns gathering, it was said, and wealthy men will be asked to give amounts equal to those which given communities may raise, or to make large subscriptions conditional upon the collection of certain amounts.

The Russian revolution is expected to furnish a fresh impetus to the campaign, and it was announced that the state department had given assurance that in the event of war between this country and the Central Powers, American diplomats to neutral countries would carry on uninterruptedly the work of feeding Jewish noncombatants.

Men associated with Mr. Morgenthau in the campaign include Jacob H. Schiff, United States Supreme Court Justice Louis D. Brandeis, Daniel Guggenheim, Nathan Straus and Herbert H. Lehman.

**How City and Country May Work Together For Common Cause**

**Principal Cumming Suggests a Practical Form of Co-operation Whereby the City Man Will Furnish the Farmers With Fertilizers and Receive Vegetables in Return; Both Helping to Win the War**

(Halifax Chronicle.)

"I never met so large a proportion of men interested in farm and garden production as I have during the past month," said Principal Cumming yesterday, in reply to a question from a representative of The Morning Chronicle. "It is particularly noticeable," he added, "in the case of city men, some of whom are planning to establish gardens, others of whom have plans for the cultivation of common and unused property, and still others of whom have still other schemes."

"All of this is splendid," added the principal. "None the less there is likely to be a good deal of misguided effort. The city man, who has a nice piece of fairly deep and well drained land at which the sun can get and who plans to do most of his work in hours of daylight, would otherwise waste, will not only make a contribution to the food supply of the Empire, but will learn the luxury and healthfulness of crisp, fresh vegetables right out of his own garden. If he is a man of small income, he will appreciate this means of reducing his cost of living. Perhaps, too, he will learn that it takes more work to grow a garden than he thought. Still, if he is in a position to do so, it will be a good thing. He will do some gardening."

**A Practical Suggestion.**

"But there are lots of city men who have no good or whose ground is too shallow or full of docks or badly drained to pay for the work it would cost to grow a garden. In this case, I think it well worth the consideration of city men who would like to make some contribution to the food supply of the Empire, I must start at the farmer's end in order to explain the scheme."

"There are hundreds of farmers in Nova Scotia, who, because of labor shortage, will not be able to cultivate their land this year than they did last year. However, these farmers can make their cultivated ground more productive by increased cultivation and increased fertilization. It is possible, for example, on a well cultivated field to produce from three hundred to four hundred bushels of potatoes per acre instead of one hundred and fifty to two hundred bushels, simply by adding one thousand to fifteen hundred pounds more fertilizer per acre than is now planned to use. Some farmers are not afraid to buy this extra amount of fertilizer, but others, because of shortage of capital or lack of confidence or fear of the fall market will not do so and consequently produce a smaller crop. It is this that might be producing maximum crops will be producing only 50 per cent to 75 per cent of that maximum."

**Provide the Fertilizer.**

"My scheme," continued the principal, "is that city men send to their relatives or friends, or farmers with whom they can be brought in touch, a half ton or a ton or more fertilizer and that an agreement be drawn up in which the farmer agrees to add this amount of fertilizer to the amount which he had originally planned to use."

"Also, and this is an important part of the scheme, appealing alike to the self pride and independence of the farmer and to the interests of the city man who contributes the fertilizer, the farmer shall enter an agreement to return to the city man vegetables and other farm produce, the city man agreeing to pay a fixed minimum price."

"This fixed minimum price is an important feature of Lloyd George's scheme for speeding up agricultural production in Great Britain. He recognized that he could not appeal effectively to the farmers for increased production as long as there was a possibility of prices falling at harvest time. In the British scheme, however, and likewise in the smaller scheme, a fixed minimum price is agreed upon and it is agreed that should the prevailing market price be higher than the fixed minimum price, the farmer is to reap the benefit."

**SAYS THEY SHOULD THANK GOD THAT ENGLAND PROTECTS THEM FROM HUMS**

**Caspar Whitney Declares This of Americans, Refuting Charges Against Britain Appearing in United States Papers**

A well timed rebuke to the pro-German tendencies of the New York Evening Post and its school and a tribute to British magnanimity, says the Toronto News Weekly, are contained in the following letter published in New York papers by Caspar Whitney.

"May I beg your indulgence and a small bit of your space for a protest against an open disregard of well-established knowledge—as to the English treatment of Germans in England? In its February 5 issue the Evening Post said editorially:

"We do not wish to see repeated here those disgraceful scenes enacted in England at the outbreak of the war when German men, women and children, who had nothing to do with the causes of the war, were turned into the streets to starve, their shops raided by mobs and their property stolen and destroyed."

"This is so gross a misstatement as to be ridiculous. It is well known to everyone having even slightest wartime acquaintance with London and the English that the Germans have been amazingly well treated by this most tolerant people on earth. No scenes such as those described by the Post were witnessed in London or elsewhere at the outbreak of the war; nor have German men, women or children been turned into the streets to starve; either at the war's outbreak or at any subsequent time."

"German business interests have been respected, German residences un molested, and German men and women given a freedom of action and a generosity of treatment that is marvellous and the admiration of every foreigner in England."

"Indeed, such extreme consideration of the subjects of an unscrupulous enemy has been criticized as unnecessary and dangerous; and in truth the Germans themselves have laughed over and plotted under the humane license."

"I found the Englishman's 'stupidity' in the stock joke among the German officers I encountered at mess and elsewhere in Belgium, Northern France, Germany and Poland."

"I state these facts from personal knowledge gained on the ground, and challenge the Post or any other pacifist belligerent to disprove them."

against the Germans, and then it was confined to the lower city quarters and quickly suppressed by the authorities. None was turned into the streets to starve; shops were raided, however, and damage done to stocks of merchandise and to property, which, at worst, was neither great nor widely distributed, and for the reimbursement of which the local governments at once set to work.

"England's conduct toward her German residents and her German prisoners and the German dead shot down from the Zeppelin assassins of the air, and delivered up by the United assassins of the sea, offers an exhibition of Christian mind and the spirit of fair play such as the world has not before recorded. One cannot become acquainted with the collective Englishman doing his bit in this war—in his towns, on the march, on the ship lines, in the hospitals in the numberless benevolent organizations, men and women—without taking off one's hat to the Old Country and its unshaken traditions."

"Those Americans that now seize upon every pretext for a cheapening of the English ought to be thanking God, and before the German beast is muzzled will be thanking God, that England is England, and that the spirit and the will to defend human right still rules in the Old World land of our Pilgrim forefathers, although apparently shaken in the New World to nothing more than a mighty erga host."

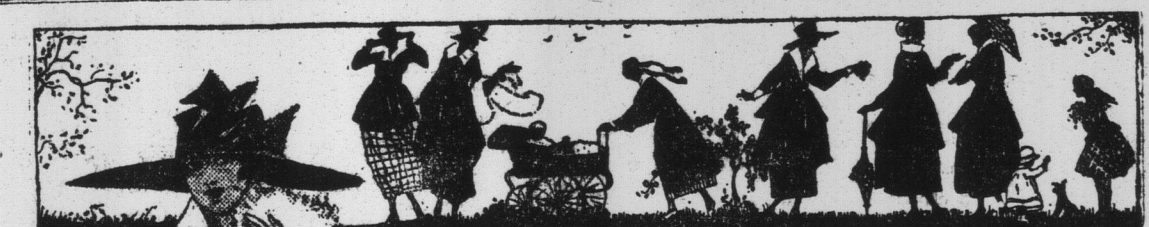
