

## TWO LIBERALS HELD ELECTED IN P. E. I.

Declaration Day in Queens Passes; McLean Gets in For Prince

CHARLOTTETOWN, Sept. 24.—To-day was declaration day in Queens county, P. E. I., and R. H. Jenkins, Liberal, and J. R. Sinclair, Liberal, were duly declared elected. The complete results follow:

The complete vote polled in the two counties was 47,073, the number of spoiled and rejected ballots being 121.

Declaration day in Kings county, the remaining constituency of the province, is not until Tuesday, September 28.

## QUEBEC TO BUY 1921 LOAN

Government Arranges to Take Up \$6,000,000 Flotation Due May 1, 1936

QUEBEC, Sept. 24.—Hon. Mr. Nicol, provincial secretary-treasurer of the province of Quebec, announces that the government will buy on Nov. 1 next the \$6,000,000 loan issued on May 1, 1921, and expiring May 1, 1936, carrying 5% per cent.

The transactions will be made at par plus accumulated interest. Until the first of November no interest will be paid on these obligations and holders of the bonds shall deliver them to the Bank of Montreal at Quebec, Montreal and Toronto.

## FALLS IN FAINT TO STATE HOUSE FLOOR

War Veteran, Out of Work, and Starving, Collapses in Boston

BOSTON, Sept. 24.—In historic Doric Hall at the State House within the sight of the Hall of Flags, where are stored the war flags of Massachusetts for which he fought in France, a starving World War veteran collapsed and fell to the marble floor. Picked up by passersby he was carried to the office of State Surgeon Frank F. Williams, where he was treated, restored to consciousness, told his story, and was then removed to the Soldiers' Home in Chelsea.

Francesco Delella, an Italian alien, enlisted in the United States Army from Massachusetts during the war. He served in combat divisions in France. His wife and three children lived in Italy. After the war he went to visit them. Finally he went to the State House and applied to the American Legion for assistance in finding a job. He was sent into the country, but the place had been filled before he arrived.

In desperation, he returned to the State House. He visited the Legion office and was about to seek state aid from the commissioner of state and pensions when his strength gave way and he crashed to the floor. Four days had passed since last he tasted food.

## HORSE RACES END IN RAIN DOWNPOUR

Dan Patchen Wins 230 Class at Charlottetown Exhibition

Canadian Press Despatch. CHARLOTTETOWN, Sept. 24.—The Provincial Exhibition horse races here closed this afternoon in a down-pour of rain, thousands of wet and shivering spectators huddled together till the last heat was over.

The 230 class pace stake, furnished the feature of the day in a great battle between Hector, the Parrsboro entry, and Dan Patchen, Lieut.-Colonel D. A. McKinnon's entry; the Hector horse taking the first two heats in 2:16 1/4 and 2:17 1/4. The Patchen horse came out and took the next three heats.

In the fifth heat only the Patchen and Hector horses came to the wire, racing neck and neck, to the quarter when Patchen went out in front and continued opening the gap to the three quarters. Hector started again but was not equal to the occasion, Patchen winning the race and first money.

## HEARING OPENS IN N. S. MURDER CASE

Examination Delayed to Hear Wife of Prisoner, Now in Hospital

Canadian Press. TRENTON, N. S., Sept. 24.—The preliminary hearing in the case of James Clow, charged with the murder here yesterday of Thomas McCoull, was continued until next Monday, upon representation of the prosecution that Mrs. Clow, who is in hospital suffering from injuries received the night of the tragedy, would be able to appear in person and tell what transpired.

Mr. Clow was in court and appeared quite calm and self-possession. His fifteen-year-old daughter Florence was also present, as a witness and cried almost continuously.

## MEXICAN CHAMBER BARS CHURCH PLEA

Canadian Press Despatch. MEXICO CITY, Sept. 24.—The Chamber of Deputies today again rejected the petition of the Roman Catholic episcopate to amend or repeal some of the religious clauses in the Mexican constitution.

The vote was 171 for rejection of the petition and one for accepting it. The chamber first rejected the petition on Wednesday, taking the stand that the petition was not in proper legal form. Yesterday plans were made, however, to continue the debate on the question, resulting in today's adverse vote.

## KILLED IN DUEL

NEW YORK, Sept. 24.—Vito Salvi, twenty-four years old, of East Thirtieth street, was shot dead in a pistol battle in front of 85 Stanton street. The police believe the fight followed a gambler's quarrel.

Residents were awakened by a volley of shots. Patrolman Salvatore Porco saw a man fleeing. He fired two shots, but the man escaped.

Salvi was identified by fingerprints. The police said his record showed he was arrested several months ago charged with attempted robbery.

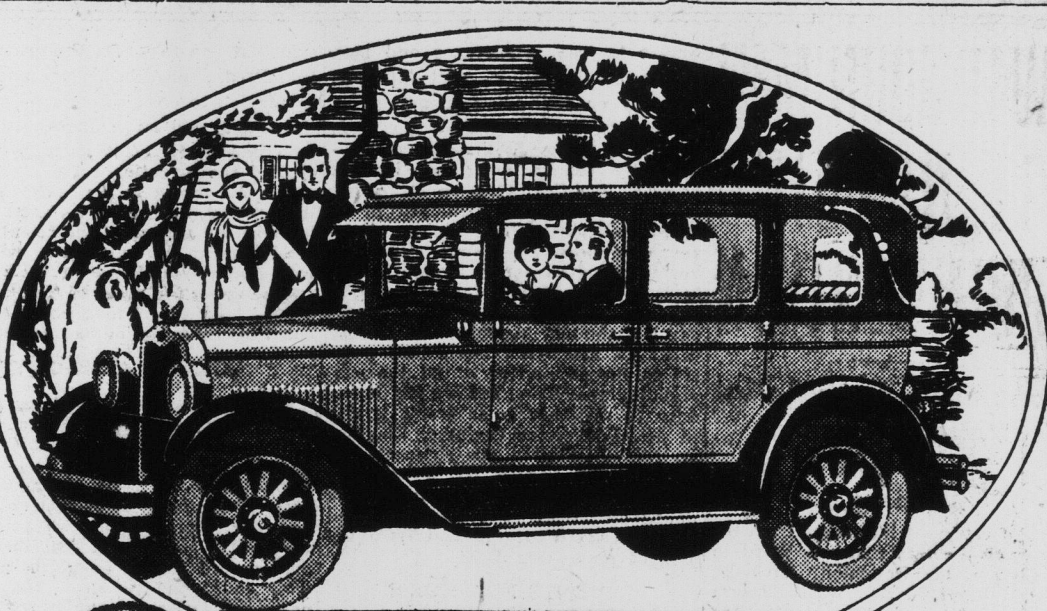
