

# 46 INDIVIDUAL BOWLING ALLEYS NOW OPERATING IN SAINT JOHN

## SPORT GROWS ENORMOUSLY IN FEW YEARS

### Hundreds Enjoy Mighty Fascinating Winter Game Here

NOW that the local bowling season has started, balls are whizzing and pins falling on 46 different alleys here, showing the great increase in patronage of this pastime that has been made in recent years. Many hundreds each evening participate in this sport, which has been also attracting the attention of the fair sex. There are 46 individual alleys in the city, as follows: Imperial, 8; Victoria, 8; Central, 8; Armories, 8; Black's, 4; Y. M. C. I., 4; G. W. V. A., 2; St. Peter's, 2, and Y. M. C. A., 2.

Bowling has been established here since 1866 when the first continuous alleys were laid down on Main street for what is now known as Black's alleys. Since that time several new alleys have been erected at a cost of many thousands of dollars.

In the 20 years that bowling has been established in Saint John many line scores have been chalked up and it is not too much to say that there is as much bowling talent in this city as there is to be found in any city of its size in the world.

#### OLDEST ALLEYS.

To Black's alleys on Main street being the oldest of being the oldest alleys in the city while the honor of being the latest goes to Mr. Vanwart, who this past week has opened eight new alleys in what is known as the Central alleys on King street. It is a curious coincidence that the record for the highest single string should be held on Black's alleys and the honor of being the holder of the Central alley record should be held by Ronald Black, son of the owner of Black's alleys.

The holder of the record for the highest single string ever rolled in Saint John belongs to a man who gave us all for his country, the late Vincent Kelly, who went overseas in 1916 and who later died in England. Kelly rolled a total of 176 and today at Black's alleys is a frame with a summary of his scores and how it was accomplished.

That was back in the days when the so-called Boston pin was not used. The pin used when Kelly bowled his remarkable score was a pin 2 1/2 inches wide at the centre, while the pin used in many alleys today and known as the Boston pin, has a width at the centre of 3 1/2 inches.

### James McCurdy Assumes Charge of The Alleys—Plans Made

An enthusiastic organization meeting of the Y. M. C. I. House Bowling League was held last evening. It was decided to limit the league to six teams and to roll on Monday and Tuesday nights. The alley team this year is to consist of the first five high average men and substitutes to be selected in rotation. To qualify a player must roll sixty per cent of the scheduled games.

The point system is to be used in scoring during the coming season and roll-offs are to be held between the winners of the different series.

Monday night the Sparrows and Owls will open the league and on Tuesday night the Hawks and Falcons will roll. The four line judge is to be dropped. The captains of the various teams are choosing their teams carefully with a view to presenting the strongest line up possible.

On Sunday afternoon a meeting will be held of the Inter-Society League and all teams intending to enter should make a point of having delegates present to represent them.
