One son, James (Dick) Tibbits, who some years ago was one of the leading athletes of the Maritime Provinces, is now a resident of Vancouver, B. C., and is a brother of the deceased.

As editor of The Royal Gazette, it is true that he did not indulge in any original comment, but he edited the paper with great thoroughness and was very loyal to him from all over the province and was sought to be made legal through publication in the weekly issue.

of the Council and Executive Committee and shall have the right to take part in all proceedings and may vote when present. This membership shall not be held by any one holding elective office.

Any person whose name is acceptable to the Executive Council may become a life member on payment of a fee of \$15 and may take part in proceedings and discussions at public meetings of the Council and may be entitled to vote. The names of such life members shall be printed immediately after those of patrons of council and they shall be entitled to receive free of charge the ordinary literature published by council. These life members shall not be debared from any elective office.

That, Whereas our constitution makes no provision for appointment of honorary president and vice-president in local councils, be it, therefore, resolved:

That three regular public meetings, exclusive of the annual meeting, be held during the year, as per clause 2, by-law 2, on meetings.

That, Whereas duplication in office is detrimental to the interest in the council, be it, therefore, resolved:

That, this committee recommends to our executive that no woman shall accept nomination or appointment on standing committee or societies which will give her duplication of office.

It was decided to defer discussion of the revision of the constitution until a later date which would involve deferring for one year any alterations in the constitution that were approved.
