When We Wound Up The Watch On The Rhine

Narrative of Canadian Participation In The Occupation of Germany After The Armistice

vigils of days and nights of warfare, had fallen into the hands of the enemy, and were there called upon to face sometimes even greater trials than they had ever experienced in the front line trenches. To them, doubtless, more than to anyone else the cessation of hostilities came as an unmeasurable blessing.

Days of Preparation.
After taking up positions just east of Mons on Armistice Day, the troops remained in this vicinity until November 21, when the march to the Rhine was commenced. For the first day or two after the close of hostilities a period of relaxation from the strenuous work of the last hundred days of the war was necessary to bring home to the men the very potent fact that the war was actually over and that it was only a matter of days until the glad news would be brought that they were to return to their homes.

During their sojourn in the Mons area, the most of the Canadian soldiers took part in the official entry into Mons, which took place a few days after the signing of the armistice, when Lieutenant-General Sir Arthur Currie, after leading his men into the city, which had been so prominent in both the beginning and the ending of British participation in the war, was given the freedom of the city.

The Belgians' Thanks.

A touching mark of the gratitude of the Belgian people was a letter or thanks prepared by the burgomaster, or mayor, of the little town of Havre in which some of the second division men were billeted while preparing for the march to the Rhine. The message was printed on a card, one side of which bore the inscription of the seal of Duc d'Onnes, more than 500 years old, while on the other side was printed in French a greeting from the people of the town to the brave soldiers Canadians who had assisted in driving from their midst the German tyrant from whom they were freed during the last four years of the war.

Besides giving the men and horses an opportunity to rest, the period of ten days between the signing of the armistice and the commencement of the trek to the Rhine was allowed to elapse in order to give the Germans a chance to withdraw beyond the river. Even this "head-start" was not sufficient as they were not later, so, entirely played out, were the Hun troops that even with short marches and frequent halts, the British troops were almost constantly in touch with the straggling remnant of the defeated foe on its last march home.

Peace is Disturbed.

The peaceful serenity of the after-war quiet preceding the advance into the enemy's country was disturbed only once and that at the dead of night. At Louviers the Germans had established a great ammunition depot and on the cessation of hostilities some hundreds of thousands of ammunition of all calibres were standing on the tracks. In some unknown way fire broke out amongst the cars late one night and in an incredibly short time the whole yard was a smoking mass of splintered railway equipment. The town, some four or five hundred yards away, suffered considerably, the houses being shaken from most of the roofs and their interiors more or less disarranged. Although several of the inhabitants were slightly injured there were no fatalities.

The noise of the explosion of the shells could be heard for miles and some of the victorious Canadian troops, sleeping peacefully with the sub-conscious feeling that it was "all over" received a rather rude awakening and it was only after the official report of the occurrence
