

McLellan is sending broadcast over the province 5,000 posters of striking appearance carrying a warning against the danger of fire about Christmas trees and suggesting the use of electric lights and non-inflammable decorations for the tree. The additional suggestion as to throwing the tree out immediately after the holiday is also an excellent one. At the bottom of the poster is the staggering statement that, exclusive of fores fires, the fire waste in New Brunswick from January 1 to September 30, 1922, was \$2,263,816. 
