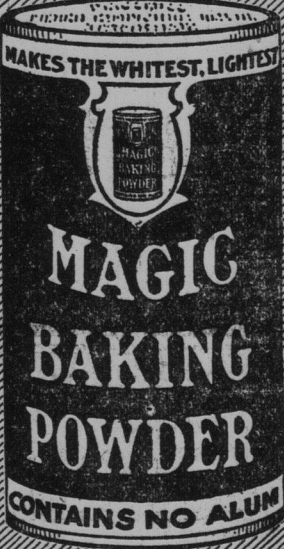

INCREASE IN WAGES ABOUT 43 PER CENT

New York Weekly Average Up From \$12.41 to \$17.66 in Three Years

New York, April 12.—The New York state department of labor, in its review of the labor market for February, shows the average weekly per capita earnings of all employees, including men and women in shops and offices in February, was \$17.66, compared with \$16.61 in January.

Although this average for February was influenced by the shutdown of many plants on account of two holidays which took place during that month, and the fuel closing order, it is only slightly below that of December, when the average was \$17.71 a week.

The corresponding figure for February, 1917, was \$15.31, for 1916, \$13.77, and for 1915, \$12.41. The highest average wages paid was to workers in pig iron and rolling mills, who averaged \$26.28, with shipbuilding employees next with an average of \$23.51, while workers doing miscellaneous sewing were lowest with \$8.85. General average increase since 1915 amounts to approximately 43 per cent.

THEY'LL BE ALL ALIKE. Amsterdam, March 2.—(Correspondence Associated Press)—Eleven hundred German towns and cities have applied for supplies of the new "state standard" garments for men and women. Half a million pairs of standard trousers are to be distributed during the next three months, and a proportionate number of other garments. Women's skirts will sell at \$4.50 to \$9, dresses at \$15 to \$21. Nobody who has an income of more than \$30 a week will be permitted to buy state clothes.

KEEP BOMBING GERMAN

T.W.S. TILL HUN GIVES UP That's The Advice of a Liverpool Officer at the Front

Liverpool, March 16.—(Correspondence Associated Press)—"The way to win the war is to keep on bombing Germany until she cries enough," writes a Liverpool army officer from the front in a letter to his home newspaper.

"You at home," he adds, "do not realize how great is the air superiority of the Allies on the west front. The means of finishing off the campaign is to create such a feeling in the German towns that the population will rise and demand the ending of the war. I know Germany well, and the bulges are real cowards at home. I believe that most of the German soldiers are sick of fighting and when they find out how much more effectively we are air-raiding than they; then will come the finish."

"I notice that in a raid on London recently, sixteen bombs were dropped. Do you realize that in our air report on Tuesday night it was stated that we had dropped more than 700 bombs? England has been slow in starting, but she is going to be terribly effective in the air, and from what I hear, the Americans are presently going to give us all a wonderful demonstration of how air-raiding should be done."

"Ruthlessness is the only thing a German appreciates and fears, and the Americans are planning to show it to him."

LAWYERS IN THE HOUSE

(Montreal Journal of Commerce.) An analysis of the list of members of the new House of Commons shows that the profession most largely represented is that of the lawyers, who number seventy-five, or one-third of the House. Probably the discovery of this fact will cause some expression of disapproval among the rural voters, who are prone to think lawyers are no better than they ought to be. Perhaps some of the lawyer-members could comfort the farmers with the assurance that once was given by a member of the profession who was a candidate in Nova Scotia in an agricultural constituency. Although admitted to the bar he was not in active practice. Learning that there was some dislike of members of the profession, he spoke of the matter at a public meeting, expressing a hope that he would not suffer on that account, since he could assure them that he "was not much of a lawyer." It may be possible to have too many lawyers in parliament, but it is certain that a house without lawyers would be a weak and inefficient body.

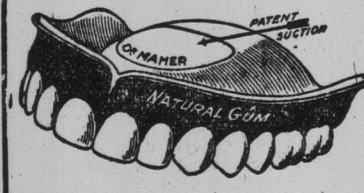

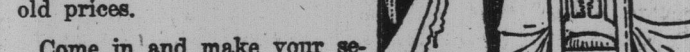
