MEET MONDAY TO FIGHT GREAT WHITE PLAGUE

An aggressive campaign against tuberculosis will be started in this city Monday afternoon. At the recent provincial meeting for organization Dr. Daniel was elected vice-president for St. John. In the line of his duty he is calling a public meeting in the Board of Trade rooms at half past three on Monday. At the meeting a local organization will be formed in whole or in part after which a plan of systematic action will be adopted.

Dr. Daniel finds that there were 115 deaths from consumption or other forms of tuberculosis in St. John last year. This is a large number than were reported in Ottawa with about double the population of St. John. He has a list of names of the employees of the city who are suffering from tuberculosis and is asking for help from the community.

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
